What is Esports

Ever Evolving Entertainment

The rapid introduction and evolvement of technology over the last two and a half decades has made change inevitable in almost every domain of our lives. From banking to communications, entertainment, medicine, the arts and sciences, technology has and will keep shifting how we perceive our lives. From our work places to our social lives, technology has made its mark. In the area of recreation and entertainment technology has had an undisputable and profound influence on how we entertain ourselves and spend our leisure time.

Birthed in the late 1970's and then popularised in the early 1980's, the introduction of "TV Games" or consoles as a new form of entertainment evolved out of a technology boom during the 1980's. By the 1990's console gaming had become a very popular form of family entertainment. Towards the end of the 1990's personal computers (PCs) became a common household 'appliance'. Video games found their way to the PC, created for the new platform which challenged and rivalled the console. As technology advanced rapidly, so too did the games (for console and PC) and with it the birth of "Gaming" as a major popular form of entertainment.

Throughout the 2000's this trend had not slowed down by any way and what was predicted by industry observers to only happen by 2012, amazingly happened in 2007; Gaming overtook Hollywood in terms of revenue generation. This dramatic increase in the gaming industry has been accredited by many industry specialists to the development of competitive gaming and the sport of gaming. Better known as electronic sports or esports, competitive gaming has become one of the fastest growing forms of sport and has gained similar appeal and status as that of football, Formula 1 racing and even the Olympics.

Going Beyond Just A Game

Gaming has developed into a sports code which sees national teams participating in international events and tournaments with a global audience of millions of fans and supporters. Esports competitions, such as the IESF Esports World Championship, can have more than 40 nations participating in the games with close to 600 participants and 5 million spectators live and online.

Namibia has in no way been left out of this new culture of esports and over the past eleven years there has been a significant increase in the number of gamers and public gaming events. Namibian esports has started to catch on and it will surely spread like wildfire in the upcoming years.



Introduction to NESA

The Namibian Electronic Sports Association (NESA) is the representative and governing body for esports in Namibia. NESA was established in 2010 and is officially recognised by and registered with the Namibia Sports Commission.

NESA is a non-profit organisation dedicated towards the development and growth of gaming as a sport in Namibia. The association promotes good sportsmanship and etiquette, legal software use and healthy sporting lifestyles. Representing Namibia on the ever-expanding international stage of esports is a fundamental part of NESA's operations and objectives.

Brief History

NESA has and continues to host various esports events across Namibia with outstanding success. Gaming events are flourishing as the number of participants, spectators, prizes and media coverage continue to expand on a yearly basis.

The very first National Team in esports was selected in 2014 for DotA2 and they were dubbed *The Desert Sidewinders*. NESA has since expanded significantly on national titles and international relations for hosting more competitions. In 2017, NESA had the privilege of sending the very first National esports athlete abroad to participate in the IESF World Championship which took place in Busan, South Korea.

2018 is marked as NESA's most successful year yet as 11 Namibian athletes were able to participate in the IESF's 10th World Championship event that was hosted in Kaohsiung, Taiwan.

With adequate support from the community and funding from dedicated sponsors, we hope to increase our National titles as far as possible to create more opportunities for our athletes and to further promote and refine professional gaming in Namibia.

NamLAN - LAN of the Brave

The pride and glory of all NESA events is the *NamLAN – LAN of the Brave* gaming competition hosted in December each year since 2008. This event is Namibia's largest annual gaming competition with up to 70 participants and lucrative prizes made possible by the event sponsors of each year. NamLAN continues to expand its horizons as this unique event continues to draw more attention and support from the Namibian public.

International Affiliations

NESA is affiliated with the International Esports Federation (IESF) which is a global organisation based in South Korea with the mission to get esports recognised as a legitimate sport. The IESF was founded in August 2008 by nine esports associations from Denmark, South Korea, Germany, Austria, Belgium, The Netherlands, Switzerland, Vietnam and Taiwan.

The IESF currently has 54-member nations and continues to grow its membership count and influence with the International Olympic Committee each year. NESA obtained membership with the IESF in 2011 and is the third country from Africa to obtain membership after South Africa and Egypt and has since also been joined by Tunisia.

In 2016, NESA gained invaluable international exposure by attending the Global Esports Executive Summit in Shanghai, as well as the World Cyber Arena's World Esports Alliance Founding Conference in Yinchuan, China. NESA again attended the World Esports Executive Summit in 2017 and 2018, both which were hosted in Busan, South Korea. These summits allowed NESA to gain a vast number of international contacts which continues to present new opportunities to the association.

NESA was invited to join the African Advisory board of the World Esports Consortium (WESCO) which is a newly established international organisation aimed at providing youth and development programs in computer literacy and gaming. WESCO is also tasked by expanding esports recognition amongst more countries which forms part of NESA's mission on the African continent.

NESA has close relations with other esports associations from African countries, namely South Africa, Ghana, Egypt, Botswana and Zimbabwe.





The Future of Namibian Esports

NESA has established itself as a community-based organisation. We endeavour to provide pathways and opportunities for all gaming enthusiasts to become active in local, national and international esports communities. All sponsorship funding is directly invested into the sport and is used to manage and improve esports as a legitimate sport across Namibia. NESA is introducing structured esports leagues to Namibian schools via the Schools Pilot Project which is kicking-off in 2019. NESA already has 7 private schools that have volunteered for the program which aims to refine the school leagues for national implementation from 2020 onwards.

NESA has successfully maintained and developed our international affiliations, however, there is still much room for expanding Namibia's exposure on the vast international stage of gaming. NESA is on the brink of exponential growth and the time is ripe for a dedicated sponsor to benefit from the amazing opportunities that are continuously presented to Namibian esports.

NESA will be offering National Tournaments in 2019 for single-player titles including FIFA19 and Tekken7, and for team titles that include Counter-Strike: Global Offensive and League of Legends.

National players from each game title forms part of the Namibian esports team that will continue to represent Namibia in international competitions.

IESF 11th Esports World Championship

The International Esports Federation was established in 2008 and has since introduced the annual World Championship competition for all IESF members to compete. This competition is unique as it is the only global esports event held between countries that explicitly recognise esports as an official sports code.


IESF member countries can enter the yearly bidding for hosting the World Championship event which is then deliberated and decided by the IESF board. The 2019 World Championship event will be hosted in Seoul, South Korea, and the game titles and dates for 2019 are still to be announced.

Global Esports Executive Summit 2019

The Global Esports Executive Summit (GEES) is a conference for gathering key esports stakeholders to standardise esports development and to involve the international sports society to openly discuss how esports can generate synergies with traditional sports. This year will be the 4th edition of GEES and the IESF will release the agenda, dates and the host city later in the year.

The 2018 GEES involved discussions on esports governance, administration and generating sustainable incomes from esports. The matter of gaming disorder was also evaluated and how a structured esports environment can support to eradicate this problem.

NESA gains invaluable exposure with each attendance of GEES as the latest developments in esports are shared at these conferences and a magnitude of international relations are built.




